

When the young were hatched, I took a little sulphur, gunpowder and lard, mixed, and greased their heads and necks, to keep off the vermin while the young brooded. "Mode of Feeding .- I took equal quantities . wheat, bran and Indian man, and wet with some milk, on lappered milk, with/n good lot of fine cut schives once in two or three days in with in and fed them till a month or six wooks old; then I sen the bran. Feed them early in the maring o keep them from rambling in the dow. "Such has been my method of feeding and masgement, and I have lost only two out of byty hrea by accidental causes out of thirty five stehed. Due, only died while young.
