Is is not surprising that capitalists loan their money for shaving purposes, instead of asing it on bonds, mortgages, Stc., when it is considered that if devoted to the latter it is taxed by the State 2 per cent., thus at the legal rate of interest cutting down the return to 4 per cent. Money is worth fully 6 per cent, spin the policy is bad that reduces that return. The law therefore, that taxes money out at a legal rate of interest, should be repealed, because it tends to defeat what business demands, and encourages shaving. Farmers have loaned their money for shaving purposes, simply to svoid the tax levied upon money loaned upon bond and mortgage at a legal rate of interest. The prospect of gain, however, is now too basardous in connection with the shaving shops, to warrant them leaving their funds in the hands of the shavers, and they are withdrawing their money from those Shylock establishments This however, will not remedy the evil. They

will hoard rather than obtain an inadequate return for their money. No, the tax on money at legal rates of interest, should be repealed.
