THE PESTS OF THE GARDEN. We make the following seasonable extract from that new and universally popular hand book of

orticulture, The Garden. These hints and direc. tions are worth the price of the book, which is one of the best and cheapest ever published : "The foca against which the gardener is force! A Chimney possessing all the required requisites, and applicable to Dwellings, Factories, Steamboats, and any position where needed.

THE benefits resulting by the use of which the gardener is forced to wage a perpetual war of extermination, though individually insignificant, are in the aggregate most formidable. We will try to give a few use full hints of a general character to aid the reader in this warfare.

"Sowing a garden with salt, at the rate of six or eight bushels to the acre, will cause many in. sects to disappear. It should be done in the autamp. Digging the soil in the winter, and thus exposing it to the frost, will destroy many grubs, etc. Wide-mouthed bottles, partly filled with molasses and water, and hung up in a garden, make excellent traps for the moths, which are the parents of many destructive vermin. Mr. Downing mentions an acquaintance who thus caught and destroyed in a single season three bushels of in-

Water your plants with this. The barrel may be refilled many times before the camphor will have all been dissolved. A cupful of strong lye put

a pound of glue to ten gallons, to make it adhere. "The most effectual and the cheapest remely for the striped bug, however, consists in defending each hill of melons, eucumbers, squashes, etc., by a box about fifteen inches square, the sides being eight to ten inches high, covered with millinet or some similar thin material.

"The following recipe for making a barrier to insects' is given in the Gardener's Chronicle. It may be casily tried: "Take of common resin one and a half pounds;

sweet oil, one pound; place them in a pipkin over the fire until the resin is melted; stir the materials together, that they may be well blended; when calls "rezoil," will be of the consistency of mulassee. To use the rezoil it should be spread with a brush upon shreds or any fitting material, and wrapped round the stem of the plant; if any support is used, that should be brushed over also.-No insect can possibly, or will attempt to cross this barrier; the rezoil never dries, but always emains sticky and clammy—its, action as a trap

Carrots consume one hundred and ninety-nine. nounds of lime to the acre; turnips but minety onnds. A cubic foot of arable land will hold forty pounds of water.

It takes five pounds of corn to form one of beef. Three and a half pounds of cooked mealwill form one of pork. To add one per cent, of lime to soil that is destitute of it requires ten pounds of slacked lime, or six of unclacked, to the acre.

Clay will permanently improve any soil that is sandy or leachy. Lime and leached ashes will also benefit leachy land. A ton of dry forest leaves produces only five hundred pounds of mold; hence five hundred

pounds of mold will produce a ton of plants. Clay applied to sandy-land is far better than . sand to clay land. One hundred and sixty tous to the acre will give an inch in depth. Pure phosphorus is worth from four to five dollars per ton; and as it comes from the earth shows
