The Mineral Wealth of the Odenwald-Letter No. 6. The Odenwald, I may premise, is a name applied to a district of country without definite boundary. It is a region as a distred with surveyor's lines and corner stones as our White Moun-tains. It may he said generally, to include that irregular mountain mais which rises between the Main and the Necker, and the Khine, and it forms a portion of the political division, Herse Darmstedt. Heidelberg stands at its southerly frontier, Darmstadt at its northerly, and the spires of Frankfort, Mayence, Worms and Manheim are visible rom its penks. The Odenwald has long been known as a region prolific in legend; and every traveler is regaled with marvelous stories of spectre horsemen, and restless knights who stay over from the olden time to frighten the eful and hospitable inhabitant of the wine-

growing villages.
We know much of the fine old-cartles, and beau we know much of the une ore-zertes, and qead-tiful views of the Odenwald from the magic pages of Longfellow and of Taylor, both of whom pass-ed through it some ten or filteen, years ago, and drew their pictures with the master's hand. Geologically, the Odenwald is an isolated mass of Granite, Syenite, and Gneiss, which on its western border rises in a remarkably straight line. out of the Cat, alluvial plain of the Rhine, and building some of its highest peaks on this border, runs off into the new Red Sandstone upon the east. The region of the Odenwald numbers among its mineral treasures several of the rarer varieties.
