LIFE OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN. Abraham Lincoln was born in Hardwood County, Kentucky, February 12th, 1809. Young Lincoln was the first of his name to be born in Kentucky. From that time until he was twenty years of age he lived in Kentucky. He was a member of the Kentucky Legislature in 1832, and was elected to the United States House of Representatives in 1846. He was elected to the United States Senate in 1858, and was elected President of the United States in 1860.
