Resolved, That in our judgment it is the opinion of the people of Pennsylvania that the constitutional rights of all sections of the country should be respected and secured, and that the laws should be promptly and faithfully executed, and that the Union of the States, the Constitution and the laws should be maintained and enforced throughout the country.

Both Senators were present. Cameron, Grow, Hickman, Morris and Verree made speeches. The action was entirely harmonious. The caucus adjourned on Thursday.
