GOD'S WISDOM ADDICTED.

IT is with general satisfaction that we are

to record the fact that the new "Tariff Bill," which various amendments, passed Congress, on Wednesday, is unique-

nably, for the purposes alike of protection

to our industry and revenues to the Gov-

ernment, the best Tariff Bill which has been

not less than one-half an inch, two

hundred and twenty-five thousand, not less than five-eighths of one inch, or more than

one-half an inch, on each, per pound;

Second. On cast iron, bars, billets, loops or

forms, less finished than iron in hand, and

more advanced than pig iron, except cast iron

which shall be manufactured, and

Third. On wire, per cent.
