

SECESSION BY SLAVERY - THE VIEW OF THE

In the United States Senate on Tuesday last Mr. Sumner introduced a series of resolutions... declaratory of the relations between the United States and the territory now occupied by certain States, and not annexed by the United States, which embodied the following:

Resolved, That slavery being a political institution... derived from laws without any origin in the Constitution or in the authority of the States... it is not a subject which is committed to the States by the Constitution.

The introduction of these resolutions, and their text will recall the recollection of the reader the fact, which has never been successfully denied, that President Lincoln in a conversation with Gen. In an article on this subject, the New York Tribune says:

It is a singular coincidence that the President has been advised in regard to the proposed amendment to the Constitution which would give to the States the right to secede from the Union.
