The capture of Fort Donelson, Tennessee, on February 15, 1862, was a decisive victory for the Union Army. The fort was held by General Simon Bolivar Buckner and his garrison of about 15,000 men. The Union Army, commanded by General Ulysses S. Grant, had surrounded the fort for several days. After a three-day battle, the rebels surrendered unconditionally.
