To put away furs, the first best plan is to expose them for half a day in the sun, then to switch them thoroughly, and, lastly, to deposit them in a trunk of camphor wood or red cedar; after having liberally soripkled them with ground black pepper. If the inside of the box be lined with a linen sheet so much the bettor, but pure black pepper, in a confined place, emits odors which stiffe insect life. If the germ of the fourre grab be in the fur a whole barrel of camphor would not deter that grub from chang-ing into aminute butterfly, and eating away the fabric. This is the time when these moths deposit their eggs in the nap of woolen goods, and among the pile of fur. The present, therefore, is the season when for the last time they should be air-ed, and then sealed closely until next October. The present is also the time to set out grown plants.


