





COLN HOMESTEAD—THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE LINCOLIN FAMILY.

Two years ago the place inherited a sad and peculiar glory in becoming the burial place of Abraham Lincoln; and ever since his tomb has been the resort of thousands of his countrymen and countrywomen. No stranger thinks of passing through Spring-field without visiting the sepulchre, and many come to Springfield for that express purpose.

Oak Ridge Cemetery, where the honored remains repose, is scarce a mile from the State House. Horse cars convey visitors thither every half hour, the route following a leading street until the latter turns into a country road, and then fades into an undéveloped, ungraded avenue; and at this point the railroad dôftly switches aside, passing through a grove of shady oaks into the public park. Just heyond this is the cemetery—an umbrageous, undulating tract, which already contains a number of graves. The Lincoln tomb is in a prominent position on the brow of a rounded knoll. It is a vault with a simple front of plain brick, faced with unpolished white marble, the wings et seed.
