A MODERN INVERSAL MACHINE, -An instrument of warfare has recently been invented by an American mechanic, which, it is asserted, will prove more destructive than any weapon heretofore known. The int consists of a row of twelve guns of 0.76 bore and about forty inches long, mounted on a carriage six feet wide, to be hauled by one horse. The barrels are divergent, so that at three hundred yards distant the twelve bullets sweep a line of about thirty feet, and are fixed at equal distances

from each other, except in the middle, where there is a space of ten inches, into which is placed a telescope, and an arrangement for adjusting the guns in taking aim. This mirivance, it is asserted, enables the operator to send a bullet through the buil's eye, at sixteen hundred yards, nine times out of ten. The tubes or barrels are loaded at the breech and are connected by a rod attached to a crank; one turn of which opens and shuts all the breech pieces and loads the gun. They are made ready for firing by another turn of the crank. The bullet, it is stated, can be fired a distance of two thousand yards. with accuracy. At a recent trial, fortigseven out of sixty shots fired, are reported to have struck a target four feet high at the distance of fifteen hundred yards. The invention weighs 600 pounds, and is intended to be hanled by one horse and worked by two men, one to drive and the other to operate The loading of the apparatus is so arranged that it can be detached in a moment, when the other part of the machine becomes perfeetly useless. The cost of the entire instrument, with the horse, is reported to be \$1000.
