Schultze and Jesse Kyler, Associates, Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions Orphans' Court, Oyer and Terminer, and General Jail delivery, for the trial of capital and other offenses in the county of Elk, by their precepts to me directed, have ordered the aforesaid named Courts to be holden at Ridgway, in and for the county of Elk, on the First Monday of November it being the 1st day of the month, and to continue one week. Notice is hereby given to the Coroner, Justices of the Peace, and Constables of the said county, that they are by these precepts commanded to be then and there in their proper persons at ten o'clock A. M., of said day, with their members, to do those things which their offices appertain to be done, and that all Justices of said county make returns of all recognizances entered into before them, to the Clerk of the Court, as per act of Assembly of March 4th 1834. And those who are bound to prosecute the prisoners that are or shall be in the jail of the county of Elk, and to be then and there to prosecute against them as shall be just.
