It is quite as important to plant trees wherever there is a lack of them, as it is to plant any other crop, and that there is no more mystery about tree-culture than there is about the culture of garden vegetables, the cereals or cotton.

Such a field may be thinned at five years from planting, the poles gathered at the first cutting being worth \$1,620. Two years later the rest of the young trees may be cut and sold for \$1,860.
