Fatal Accident to William Spain.

Tuesday morning William Spain, a well known and highly esteemed resident of Newell's Creek, near the Catholic church, and two of the Mateson boys had been to Eldred and were returning, and when about to turn from the main road up the Newell creek valley, got into a friendly strife in speeding their respective horses along the way home. By some accident not possible to explain, the buggy in which Mr. Spain was seated, was wrecked and the occupant hurled to the ground with force sufficient to fracture his skull, from the effects of which the unfortunate man died at 10 o'clock the same evening.

The death of William Spain will be felt in the neighborhood in which he lived, and indeed, wherever he was known, as he was of that generous nature which made friends of all with whom he came in contact, a good neighbor and an enterprising business man. All that could be done for him was done, but his injuries were necessarily fatal. A large number of friends and neighbors were about him when he died, and evinced the most sincere grief at his untimely falling off.
