LONDON, July 28. CHINESE EMBASSY.

The following account by an officer in the East India company's service, we insert as a supplement to that we have already given.

Lord Macartney, with his sleet, in number the Lion, 64, the Bindostan, and three Imails re Lin, 04, the Bindottan, and three Imailer veffels, arrived at the mouth of the river cading up to Pekin, in July last, where the hips anchored, tho' a very great distance rom the land; the small vessels could almost get to the mouth of the river, where he sound in wasting to receive him many boats, and wo Mandarines of great rank with the shore ided on all sides with thousands of people; to was attended by Sir G. Staunton and all his relinue.

On his arrival at Pekin, the Emperor ordered a large house, with every kind of accommodation, provisions, &c. to be procured him, his retinue, and ships, at the expence of government. The ships were ordered to a port called Tez Chew, about four days fall to the Southward, where Lord Macartney left them to wait further orders, where every accommodation, and in saft every thing they wanted for, was allowed them gratis. The ships were permitted to go to any harbout or ever on the coast without molestation. As an instance how delicate and extended was their protection, a Mandarin of some rank and insulted one of the midshipuned of the Lion; a complaint was lodged, and the offender was degraded by the ornament of his button and cap being taken from him, and he was bamboo'd or slogged severely. Lord Macartney and his suite left Pekin the beginning of September, for Geliol, the country residence of the Emperor, about 150 miles distant, and on the 14th, he was introduced. The ceremony used on this occasion was estable similar to that observed on the Durch embally, in 1616. On the 20th they arrived on the 26th, and on the 30th left that thy on their return to Canjon, attended by a large guard, and supplied with cartnages, &c., in abundance. The Emperor took much source of Si G. Staunton's son, who spoke a lintle Chinese to him; he appeared sensities and inqustrive; he was 8g years of age on the 17th of September, but had every appear ace of health and vigour; he was dresed in yellow, with a prosinion of embroides to discount the solution of embroides.
