This Lottery will afford an e.egant specimen of the private buildings to be erect d in the City of Washington—Two beautiful defigns are already selected for the enrire fronts on two of the public squares; from these drawings, it is proposed to erect two centre and tour corner buildings, as soon as possible after this Louery is fold, and to convey them when complete, to the fortunate adventurers, in the manner described in the scheme for the Hotel Louery. A nest deduction of five per cent, will be made to desizy the necessary expenses of printing, &c. and the surplus will be made a part of the fund intended for the National University, to be erected within the City of Washington.

(The drawing will commence as soon as the Tickets are sold, or at all events on Monday, the 22nd of December next: The money prizes will be payable in thirty days after it is smithed, and any prizes for which fortunate numbers are not produced within twelve months after the drawing is closed are to be considered as given towards the fund for the University, it being determined to settle the whole business in a year from the ending of the drawing and to take up the bonds given as security.
