Scheme of a Lottery,
To raise 30,000 Dollars, on 266,000 Dollars
Deducting 15 per Cent. from the Prizes—
This Lottery consists of 38,000 Tickets, in
which there are 14,539 Prizes, and 23,461
Blanks, being about one and a half blanks to
a prize.

THE Directors of the Society for establishing
Useful Manufactures, having resolved
to erect LOTTERIES for raising ONE
HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS, agreeably
to an Act of the Legislature of the State of
New-Jersey, have appointed the following
persons to superintend and direct the drawing
of the same, viz. Nicholas Low, Rufus
King, Hermon Le Roy, James Watson,
Richard Hamilton, Abijah Hammond, and
Cornelius Ray, of the city of New-York—
Thomas Willing, Joseph Ball, Matthew M.
Connell and Andrew Bayard, of the city of
Philadelphia—His Excellency Richard How-
ell, Esq. Elias Boudinot, General Elias Day-
ton, James Parker, John Bayard, Doctor
Lewis Donham, Samuel W. Stockton, Joshua
M. Wallace, Joseph Bloomfield, and Elifsa
Boudinot, of New-Jersey, who offer the
following Scheme of a Lottery, and pledge
themselves to the public, that they will take
every assurance and precaution in their power
to have the Monies paid by the Managers,

inspection of a Committee of the Superintend-
ants, as soon as the Tickets are sold, of
which timely notice will be given.

The Superintendants have appointed John
N. Camming, of Newark, Jacob R. Har-
denberg, of New-Brunswick, and Jonathan
Kies, of Trenton, as immediate Managers
thereof, who have given ample security for
discharging the trust reposed in them.

In order to secure the punctual pay-
ment of the Prizes, the Superintendants of

shall each enter into bonds in 45,000 dollars,
