INTERCEPTED CORRESPONDENCE.

General Melas to Count de Tinge, at Vienna. Turin June 5, 1800.

General, Gorrup being no longer able to defend the Col di Tenda, he arrived yesterday at Canen, of which he is to take the command. As the passage by the Col. is shut to Gen. Elsnitz, I have left the latter at liberty to make for the plains of Piedmont, by fuch a route as he thould think most convenient and I am waiting for his report. Until I receive it I can undertake nothing with the divilions of Kaim and Haddick, who are still in the same positions which I mentioned to you.

Besides, as Field Marshall Ott wrote to

me of the 2d of June, that at the moment when orders had arrived at Sestri to raise the blockade of Genoa, Maffena was inclined to capitulate, and with this view had fent to Sestri, General Andreau, as Plenipotentiary, as the conferences had begun the fame day at Riverola, in concert with colonel Pell, and captain Bevers, on the part of the English, as they were to continue the 3d and as Geo. Ott thought proper to delay man departure for fome days longer, to wait the end of the negociations which might bring about a capitulation, I determined the more readily to give orders, and Gen. Elfnitz might fill be retarded for fome days, that the bridge head of Placentia should be guarded with more troops, that the Po prevent and attempt of the enemy to pass that river, and that the probable fall of Genoa allowed us to hope that affairs would ere favourable turn.

Nor would it be at all aftonishing if Buonaparte should aim at a virtual controul over the destinies of both Europe and America.
