They exerted themselves in the most laudable manner and their exertious were happily successful in checking the licentious spirit of a merciless and sanguine faction. Indeed no other conduct could be expected from any part of a garrifon commanded by a general, whose pru-dence and moderation at all times will ever endear him to truly loyal and peaceable in habitants of this city.
