## LOSS OF SHIP HOPE.


Laft evening arrived in town, Elihu Doty, late mafter of the flip Hope, of this port. by whom we learn the lots of that flipthe following particulars of which diffrefing event, are haftily c lleft d from his proteft, made at Portfmouth.

She failed from Wilmington, N C on the 19th Aug. for J maica, laden with lumber and corn-on the 6th Sept. in lat 26 00 N long 69 30 W. met with a fe-vere gale of wind—on the 8th, the gale increafed, and the fhip leaked to much that notwithstanding the deck-load was thrown over, and every xertion made at the pumps, at IT o'clock P. M. the water came over the cabin floor; the wind at this time blow-ing fo exceffively hard, as to bring falt wa-ter over the veffel, fo as to endanger fmothering a man on deck, in addition to the rain which we supposed had be n inceffant & very hard for 24 hours, as it had b en almost as dark at noon as at night, but the rain could not be diffinguished from the drift of the fea, which flew over the maft heads ; it was now found seceffary to cut 200 away all three of the mafts to prevent the 200 fhip from upleting; at 12 o'clock at night 380 the thip was entirely filled with water, and a high fea beating over he ; John Bolter, a feaman, was walked overboard and drowned: the reft of the people, 7 in number, fecured themfelves by lafhings, at 4 o'cl ck A. M. on the 9th, the gale, which for 30 hours had feemed continually to increase, abated a little, when it was found that three 433 wax candles, were every eatable thing that could be obtained, and no fresh water ; found a drowned rat, and laid it afile.

The diffress of the people from this time till the 17th, are hardly to be deferibed on the 10th, they eat part of the rat, alfo found a pi ce of pork ; the 12th, obtained more meat, but their throats were too much parched to fwallow; very hot weather for feveral days paft, and wind light: from a fhower in the evening caught a little water -14th, caught more water, & from the great temptation drank fo much as to have very pr judicial effects : 15th, high fea, deck began to rip up; 16th, good weather; 17th, were taken off by fhip Mercury, Capi. Jacob Tredwell, of Portfmonth, and arrived at that port on the 2d O& — The next day. Mark Lamb, one of the feamen, who had to the gale.


