From any other place, 18, 7-10, 29 7-10, 55 cents per lb.

All dutied articles, imported into the United States, not having been landed more than one year, are allowed a drawback of the duties subject to a deduction of one per cent except spirits, which is one half cent per gallons Of those articles that have no price affixed to them, their is either none at market, or such price cannot be afcertained as to depend upon it.
