PHILADELPHIA PRICES CURRENT, IN DOLLARS AND CENTS.—NOVEMBER 3, 1800.

The following DUTIES are such as arise on Importations in American Vessels. An Additional Duty of Ten per Cent. is imposed on all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Imported in Foreign Bottoms.

Table with multiple columns listing various goods (Almonds, Bacon, Beer, Bricks, Butter, Candles, Coffee, etc.) and their current prices, along with duties and wholesale prices.

* Note. Salt weighing more than 56 lb. per bushel, pays 20 cents per bushel or less, 20 cents per bushel, in American vessels; if in foreign vessels 22 cents.—From the Cape of Good Hope, or beyond 20 per cent is added to the cost of all goods paying an advalorem duty.
