

In pursuance of an all of Congress, passed on the 23d day of April, one thousand eight bundred, entitled "An all to establish a General Stamp Office,"

THAT a General Stamp Office is now established at the feat of government, in the city of Washington, from whence there will issue, from and after the date hereof, (upon the application of the Supervisors of the Revenue, under whose management the collection of the flamp duties is placed) any quantities of paper, parchment and vellum, marked or flamped, and duly counter flamped, with the following rates of duty which are demandable by law :

H That the power of the supervisors of the Revenue to mark or flamp any vellum, parchment or paper chargeable with duty, will cease and determine from and after fix months from the date hereof, to wit, on the fast day of February 1801.

That, if any persons shall, after the last

day of February 1801, have in their cuflods or post-flion, any vellum, parchiment or paper, marked or flamped by the supervisors of the Revenue, upon which any matter or thing, charged with duty, shall not have been written or printed, they may at any time within the space of sixty days after the said last day of February 1801, bring or fend fuch velium, parchment and paper, unto feme office of inspection, and in heu thereof, receive a like quantity or value of vellum, parchment and paper, duly stamped in pursuance of the act herein before recited. And in cafe any perfor shall neglect or refuse, within the time aforesaid, to bring or

cause to be brought unto some officer of inspection, any such vellum, parchment or paper, it is hereby declared, that the same will hereafter be of no other effect or use, than if it had never been marked or stamped, and that all matters and things, which may af-

ter that time be written or printed upon any vellul, parchment or paper, authorized to be exchanged in manner aforelaid, will be of no other effect, than if they had been written or printed on paper, parchment or vellum, not marked or stamped.

And for the convenience of those persons who may be inclined to have their own vellum, parchment and paper flamped or marked, it is hereby peclared, that when any perfon shall deposit any vellom, parchment or paper at the office of a supervisor, accompanied with a lift, spreifying the number and denomination of the stamps or marks, which are defired to be thereto affixed, the same will be transmitted to the General Stpam-Office, and there properly marked or flamped, and forthwith fent back to the fame supervifor, who will thereupon collect the duties and deliver the paper, parchiment or vellum, to the order of the person from whom the
