Leave Charleston every Wednesday by 6 A.M. arrive at Gardens Corner on Thursday by 10 A.M. and arrive at Savannah on Friday by 6 P.M. Returning, Leave Savannah every Saturday by 1 P.M. arrive at Gardens Corner on Monday by 9 A.M. and arrive at Charleston the next Tuesday by noon.

95. From Gardens Corner (on the road from Jackfonborough to Coofawatchie) to Beaufort, once a week. Leave Gardens Corner every Thursday by 11 A.M. arrive at Beaufort by 2 P.M. Returning, Leave Beaufort by 4 P.M. and arrive at Gardens Corner by 7 P.M. same day.

96. From Augusta by Washington, Greensborough, Lexington and Georgetown, to Augusta, once in two weeks. Leave Augusta every other Saturday by 6 A.M. arrive at Washington on Sunday by 11 A.M. and at Augusta the next Wednesday by 6 P.M. waiting at each Post-Office on the route 2 hours.

Note 1. The Post Master General may alter the times of arrival and departure at any time during the continuance of the contracts, he previously stipulating an adequate compensation for any extra expence that may be occasioned thereby.

Note 2. Half an hour shall be allowed for opening and closing the mail at all offices where no particular time is specified.

Note 3. For every hour's delay (unavoidable accidents excepted) in arriving after the times preferred in any contract, the contractor shall forfeit one dollar; and if the delay continue until the departure of any depending mail whereby the mails destined for such depending mail lose a trip, an additional forfeiture of five dollars shall be incurred.

Note 4. Newspapers as well as letters are to be sent in the mails; and if any person making proposals desires to carry newspapers other than those conveyed in the mail for his own emolument, he must take in his proposals for what sum he will carry it with that emolument and for what sum without that emolument.

Note 5. The contracts are to be in operation on the 1st day of January next, and to continue until the 1st day of April, 1798.

Note 6. Should any persons making proposals desire an alteration of the times of arrival and departure above specified, he must take in his proposals such alterations and the difference they will make in the terms of his contract.

Note 7. Persons making proposals are desired to state their prices by the year. Contractors may receive their pay quarterly.
