"If the notary or other magistrate has reason to believe that he is the person he represents himself to be, he will also certify it.

And if the proof be made by a witness or witnesses, he or they must swear to some general state of their knowledge of him, which matter must be fet forth in the certificate; and the notary public, or other magistrate, before whem the acknowledgment is made, must also set forth that the witness or witnesses have been for upwards of personally known to him.
