

THE MONEY MARKET.

We have this morning a fair amount of business in the money market. The market is generally quiet, with a few exceptions. The following are the principal items of business:

RECEIPTS AND PAYMENTS. Received of the Treasury, \$1,000,000. Paid to the Treasury, \$500,000. Received of the public, \$2,000,000. Paid to the public, \$1,500,000.

MARKET RATES. Money at call, 10 per cent. Money at 30 days, 10 per cent. Money at 60 days, 10 per cent. Money at 90 days, 10 per cent.

EXCHANGE RATES. London, 100 shillings = 4.84 1/2 dollars. Paris, 100 francs = 16.63 1/2 dollars. Gold, 100 dollars = 3.75 francs.
