

Maria Edgeworth mallest and least imaginative of moral and model writers, shows, as clearly as the nose upon an infant's face, that the ill luck of Murad, with the disastrous sobriquet, was altogether caused by misconduct of his own—that Fate, whom he upbraided, had nothing to do with it-that his own particular misfortunes vere caused by his own especial ill-doingsind that, in this "wale of tears," as Sarah here meets with heavy punishment here?

Gamp would say when she became sentimen. tally maudlin over her gin, every person's misfortunes arise from his or her own particuar misdeeds. We are inclined to think that Maria Edgeworth, as aforesaid, was correct in her conclusion, and even (though that would needlessly start a serious theological question,) that she was pretty correct, also, in believing, with Lord Braon, that in this life wrong-doing is its own avenger. Surely, the bad that we do England, it seems to us, is a sort of political Murad the Unlucky.
