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

Niagara Falls in Art. It is almost like attempting to paraphrase Holy Writ to undertake to transfer upon canvas the submity of Niagara. None but a child of genius can sfely venture upon either. The former may b olbrated when executed by a Milton, and whe ve are presented with an adequate portraiture of d latter, we may rest assured that its authorship longs to little less than a Milton in art. There re many reasons to make even the boldest artis rink from painting, for popular criticism, a subect which in its murvellous sublimity stands alone. wo artists, however, Church and Gignoux, have had the courage to attempt this difficult task, and the fruits of their skill are now on exhibition at the gollery of Messrs. James S. Earle & Sons, No. 816 Chestnut street, where they are attracting hundreds of visiters. An examination of then ought to convince the most skeptical that difficul hings are not always impracticable. The two pictures, which are of nearly equal sixe whilst they exhibit at a glance the same great subject, are nevertheless, owing to the opposite points from which they were taken, very different. character; although each may be said to attes the fidelity of the other. Mr. Church's ploture resents the Falls and their grand surroundings as seen from the Canada shore; Mr. Gignoux, ey appear from Goat Island. Both are works of irt, in themselves sufficient to render their author mortal in their profession, although the former s unquestionably the greater success. Its wor lerful breadth of perspective, transparency o ploring, and effective management of details, have not been surpassed, and rarely equalled, by any similar work of art exhibited in this city for many years. Indeed, as the eye rests steadily upon the licture, one feature after another expands into the iant proportions of the Falls, as they are seen in ature; the painted spray rising from the mighty abyss loses its opaque humidity, and becomes par tially penotrable; the rainbow vaults heaven ward a real thing, and one feels as if nothing wa anting to complete the duplicate but the thurder of Niagara's eternal roar. The rushing waters, a hey near the awful leap, foam with the rage of

han the water, as it glides, in gauze-like folds over the edges of the rocks before it reaches the Falls. The great merit of this picture is, that t is as faultless in details as it is striking in gene The picture by Mr. Gignoux (which, by the way, is not the one exhibited by the Messra. Earl me months ago) is unquestionably a fine work o art also. The view which it presents, however, i ess effective, and, upon the whole, hardly rivals the other in any one particular. From the point from which this was taken, the tower necessarily occupies a conspicuous place in the scene. In the other, this feature looms up in the distance, more as it is seen from the shore by visiters. This pro ninence of the tower, arrayed in its wintry habili ents, is a little too striking in Mr. G.'s picture or the best effect. Both these gentlemen have nowever, achieved a noble triumph in preservin for future generations, so faithful a portraiture of
