POSTAGE TO BRAZIL BY THE FRENCH MAIL—PREPAYMENT OFFICHAL —The French Government has recently concluded a postal convention with Brasil, by the terms of which letters may hereafter be transmitted between the United States and Brasil, via France, in the French mail, at a postage charge of thirty-three cents, the single rate of onclorith ounce or under, which embraces the full postage (United States, French, and Brasilian) chargeable to destination, and may be prepaid or left unpsid, in either country, at the option of the sander. Closed mails for Brasil will be regularly despatched by the French concess office, Bordeaux on the 24th of each month, and by the British mail nackets leaving Southampton on the 9th of each month.
