A NEW PROMIBITORY LAW.—A proposed amendment to the Constitution so as to prevent the sale of intoxloating liquors as a beverage, passed the Assembly of New York, on Friday, by a vote of 69 to 33. It had already passed the Se-nate, and has now to be submitted to the Legisla-ture chosen at the next general election of Sena-tors, and, if again adopted, to the people.
