It is not doxbred that Congress have power to increase the regu-lar army to the number contemplated by the bill under consideration, or to any larger number deemed neces-sary for the protection and vindication of the Union and its laws i but it is doubted that Congress Dossenses the power, in definee of the letter and spirit of the Consti-tution, to transmute volunteers into regulars, and regu-lars into volunteers. The two systems are made different and distir.ct, in their whole object and organization, by the Constitution itheif; and they must be kept so by law. Had your committee felt no distrust of the present as the proper time for reflecting radical charges in our mili-tary system, nor found any constitutional embarrass-ments in the way of recommending the nissense of the bill by the Senate, there exist other substantial objec-tions, which would alone impel them to withhold such recommendation. Our people are not a military people. Practising the gender arts of peace, we have been builders, not destroy-ers; and the instruments by which we have reclaimed a land from barbarism to civilization have not been the gun, the savie, and the lance, but the plough, the loom, and the anvil. It is thus thet the dispositions of our people have harmonized with the true interests of our country. A large military establish nent is the bane of any nation, exhausting its resources, and endangering its ill-erities. Hawgily for us, the unarring instincts of our virtnoue, intelligent masses have uniformly linwarfed all the attempts of ambitious men to create great standing armies; and the saving of our wealth, which has made us strong, and the preservation of our institutions, which has lafe us free, is owing, more than to all other causes, to the peaceful temper of our people, and to their jealons love of personal freed.m.
