KAILROAD ITEMS.—PROPOSED RAIL-ROAD THEOUGH SOUTHERN PENNSYLVANIA.— It is not a little singular that in this time of direct taxas It is not a little singular that in this time of direct taxes and general stringency of money, railroad speculations were never so bold and numerous. We have received the report of a survey of the "South Ponnsylvania, or Sher-man's Valley Rairoad," from J. Worral, negimeer. It pro-poses the location of a road from Harrisburg to Bridge-port, Brdford county, and thence to West Newten, on the Youghingen, in Westmoreland county, travorsing in addition the counties of Semerset, Fulton, Juniata, and Perry. The exgineer thus speculate as to the commer-cial importance of the district traversed : A branch lime of some 8 miles would give access to the south side of Broad Top, where the magnificent coal of those nearners—whon 120 square miles in area—would be rendered more accessible to market by from 25 to 30 miles than it how is. As for iron ore, it is difficult to say where it does not exist in aluméance, at points quile accessible to our line; one or iwo of cur railroad excavations being in the very ore itself.

As for iron ore, it is difficult to say where it does not exist in abundance, at points quite accessible to our line; one or iwo of our rulroad excavations being in the very ore itself. Several mineral springs are also quite close to us—the Warm Spring of Perry county and the well-known Bed-ford Springs among the number; the latter being made by this line lut a few beurs more distant than Saratoga is from New York, and being easily reached from that city, Philadelphia, or Baltimore, in a single day's ride. At Weat Newton some thirty miles of railway would connect us with Washington, Pennsylvania, a point about thirty-five miles from, and now connected by rail-road with, Wheeling, Virginia, the Western terminus of the Baltimore and Obio Baliroad. The face of the country along our line very much re-semblas the red shile country of New Jersey, through which the New Jersey Central Railway passes. The same rich soil, the same occasional limestone dykes, the same neumdant character of forest, which in that part of New Jersey originally existed, but which the more dense populations have thinned and brought under cultivation. The vegatable product salog this road would asport it alone; the nineral products added would make it highly profitable, even if it chould not prove to be the track for traffic between the East and the West—excelling all others in easy graduation, falling short of all others only in length.

in length. There are two sources other than local subscriptions from which the road might be built, namely: lst. The interest of the Philadelphis and Reading Railroad Con-pany; 24. The interest of the Central Railroad of New Jercey and its corrections.

pany; 2d. The interest of the Central Railroad of New Jersey and its corrections.
Arrangements are in progress for the opening of a new relificad line to Sunbury and Williamsport, via Schuyl-kill Haven, Ashland, and Shamskin. This route diverges from the Reading Railroad at Schuylkill Haven, and crosses the mountains by inclined planes.
The Philadciphia and Erie Railroad, since the time it was leased by the Pennsylvania Central Company, has been rapidly pu-hed forward to completion. Gangs of men are at work at both ends, but there is no probability that the cars will be running between this city and the lakes before January, 1863.
The Schuylkill and Snsqueebanna Railroad, from Harrishug to Auburn, after having passed through a series of financial mishape, and been in the bands of numerous parties, is now run by the Reading Railroad Company.
The Mourt Carbon Railroad is now undergoing repairs preparatory to running locomotives to and from the mines. The road has been under the control of the Philadciphia and Reading Railroad Company since the lat instant. instant.
