MEDICAL STOREKEEPERS .- The following extract of an act of Congress in relation to the appointment of Medical Storekeepers is published for the information of persons desirons of applying for such a

position :

position:
Ax AOT to authorize the appointment of Medical Store-keepers and Chaplains of Hossials.
Be it enocied by the Senate and House of Repre-sentatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of War be authorized to add to the medical department of the army medical torekeepers, not exceeding six in number, who shall have the pay and emoluments of military storekeepers in the quartermaster's department, who shall be skilled apothecaries of druggists, who shall are the bond and security required by existing laws for military store-keepers in the quartermaster's department, and who shall be stationed at such points as the necessities of the army may require: Provided, That the provisions of this act shall remain in force only during the contiau-ance of the present rebellion. Approve May 20, 1862.
II. The following are the regulations which will go. II. The following are the regulations which will goern the appointment of medical storekeepers under the

first section of the foregoing act of Congress: 1. A board of not less than three mcdical officers will be assembled by the Secretary of War to examine such applicants as may, by him, be authorized to appear be-fore the secretary of the se ore It -2. Candidates, to be eligible to examination, shall be 2. Conditioners, to be engine to examination, many ex-not less than tweaty-five years or more than forty years of age; shall possess sufficient physical ability to per-form their duties satisfactorily; and shall present with their applications satisfactory evidence of go d moral character.
