TRAITORS IN OUR . MIDST .- Judge TRAITORS IN OUR MIDST. Judge Butler, of West Chester, in a recent charge to the grand jury, said that at this june, when the Government of the United States is engaged in putting dewn rebellion scalars, and ordered a draft to be made from the militia of the several States, it becomes the duty of the court to invite your carnest attantion to the provisions of an act of Assembly, approved the 18th day of April, 1861, which providee for the punishment of traitors at home. The judge, after reading this act to the grand jury, said : "If you know of any person, or persons, who are guilty of any one or more of these offences specified in this act of Assembly, it is your duty to presen him, or them, for trial and punishment. Such offences are of the gravest oba-racter; they strike at the foundation of all has and order, and threaten the pace and astery of the entire community. They deserve swift and severe punishment; and we trust that no one will be allowed, for an instant, to doubt that there is anticient power in the court, or virtue in its jurors to inflicit if At a time like the present, when bad, abadoned men are defying the rightful authority of the Government and encouraging a spirit of lawless-ness throughout the country, every consideration of public and personal security demands an increased vigi-larce on the part of those whose cuty it is to uphold the law, and maintain the public order. No offence against government, nor infraction of the public peace, as by lawless tumult, or riot, or attempt to, incite men to the commission of these and kindred offences, can, at this time, be allowed to pass unpunished, without danger of commission of these and kindred offences, can, at this time, be allowed to pass unpunished, without danger of the most serious consequences to the community.
