and a brave soldier. At the early age of twenty-two, he sacrificed his life for his adopted country, leaving many sorrowing friends here, and in a distant isle his parents and relatives, to mourn his early loss. But they can be comforted with the knowledge that he lived and died a true Christian.

Being in the same company with him, we were often together. He was a genial c-mpanion and a true friend. He had the hoforable and hazardous post of color-beaver. Tall in stature and manly in behavior, he looked and was every inch a soldier. But, alast soon that fatal disease, consumption, took hold of him, brought on by the fatigues and hardships he had gone through. He sank quietly to skep in Jesus. Beloved and respected by the whole company to which he was attached; his comrades will never forget the name of ROBERT B. KERR, Company G. Anderson Troop. (15th Pennsylvania Gayalry.)
