There is no competition hetween the New York lines, or between them and the Pennspl-vania Central, and there is likely to be nove. There has been no reduction of irrights or fares, and there is no reason to expect any. There never was a time when the managers of the leading roads had so little to gain and so much to lose by competition, or when their managers were work-ing in more perfect harmonv. It is true that a quarrel has broken out between the Great Weat ern of Oanada and the lines west of Lake Erie, which has led to a reduction of through fares on the Fort Wayne road, and likewisa, we pre-sume, on the Michigan roads. But the Pennsyl-vania Central wisely keeps out of the dight, and re-fures to prorate with the Fort Wayne is compelled to sell its cheap through tickets by way of the Allean town line. The Shoe and Leather Reporter, August 13th, says: The excessive heat of the week has operated to keep back buyers, but sales have been unusually good, especially with manufacturers for the first of. August. More Southern buyers have been in mar-ket during the week than at any previous date since early in the spring of 1861. The regular jobbers whose trade lies in the West and South, are mostly busy, though not so fully employed as, from ac-counts, they expect to be after the mitdle of the mooth. The near-by trade are only sending for-ward a few orders. Manufacturers are exneatly en-gaged, and in nearly every case upon orders, except where they are declined at ruling rates. Prices of good size very firm. Not only are the difficulties of producing workmen and the firmness in leather con-sidered, but the prospect that the Mississippi valley is to be opened to trade, and that numerous buyers will flock in to market to find a small stock of shoes in manufacturers' hands, operates to strengthen quotations and increase production. The pros-pects are now favorable for an active and prosper-ous season.
