The heavier boats anchor in mid-stream. and command both shores for a considerable dis-The rebels are threatening that they will complete the blockade of the Mississippi, so that navigation will cease. It has been ascertained that the rebel Government has sent commissions to guerilla eaders, and given them special authority to raise ands for marauding purposes. The returned soldiers and deserters from the rebel army are organizing into pillaging bands with great alacrity, in order to escape all possibility of conscription into the rebel service. The guerilla warfare is more pleasant than that in the regular rank and file of the lonfederate army, besides being far more profitabl

It is not surprising that men should prefer it to the more irksome duty in the field. The rebel Governrist has continually asserted that it did not ap-prove of guerilla warfare, but the issuing of commissions to guerilla captains would seem to prove the truth of the reverse of their assertions. It is not at all likely that the robels will succeed in stopping navigation. All the firing they have done has caused but little damage either to life or property, and there can be only a slight fear of their causing much injury in the time to come. They may render it necessary for the better security of passen-gers that the steamers shall be convoyed by gun-boats. This will make the journey in either direction a little longer, but will not add much to the inconvenience of the trip, as convoy was established gemi-weekly from Vicksburg to New Orleans as soon as the former city fell.
