In the House of Commons on the 7th instant, another debate took place on the subject of the Canadian defences. Lord Eleko moved for the correspondence with the Canadian Government relative to the proposed defences of Canada, and the share of the total cost which is to be respectively borne by Canada and the Imperial Government. He deprecated the pro-ject of erecting forlifications in Canada, which only have the effect of inviting the Americans to make Canada the battle-ground, whereas the real defence of Canada was to attack America elsewhere. Sir J. D. Hay urged the impolicy of the proposed fortifications, which would be en: of by an invad-ing force. He advocated the fortification of Hall-tax, and the construction of the Inter-colonial rail-way, by means of which a body of troops could be thrown on the flank of any invading force. Mr. Buxton had the following amendament on the paper : "That in the opinion of this House it is the duitor ther Malgety's Government to submit to the deliberate decision of the people of Canada the question whether they desire the United Kingdom to take part in their defence on land, or whether is of consider that her doing so greatly increases the risk of their country becoming the thestre of war." He could not, by the forms of the House, put this amendment, but he strongily urged upon the Government to adopt the course which he re-sommended.
