The tenth anniversary of the Children's Home of west Philadelphia was held last evening, in Rev. Dr. Builder's durively, Walaut street, east of Fortieth. Owing, no doubt, to the stormy Weither, the st-tendance was not so large as might have been ex-pected, but the church was, nevertheless, pretty well filled. The children of the Home, looking par-ticularly interesting, contented, and happy, coca-pied seats in front of the pulpit. The exercises com-menced at 8 o'clock, and consisted of singing and re-citations by the scholars, prayer by Rev. Mr. Gastle, reading of report by Rev. Dr. Butler, addresses by Hon.
