CAPTURE OF JACKSON, MISS.

(Official) Dispatch from Gen. Grant.

Washington, May 21.—The following was received to-day at the Headquarters of the Army: JACKSON, Miss., May 13, 1863, via Memphis, 20.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn., May 21, 1863. General Sheridan's report says that the rebel army Grant has defeated Johnston, and has secured the railroad bridge across the Big Black, thus cutting off Johnston's communications.
