THE SIEGE OF VICKSBURG.

FLAGSHIP BLACK HAWK, HAINES' BRIG, YAZOO RIVER, MAY 29, 1863. To the Hon. Gordon Waller, Secretary of the Navy...

The reconnoitering was kept up furiously for some time, when, by the aid of guns, I discovered a company of our artillery advancing, taking a position, and driving the rebels before them.

I immediately said that General Sherman's division had come into the left of Snyder's Bluff, and that the rebels at that place had been cut off from joining the forces in the city.

In the meantime, Lieut. Candor Walker, in the Beulah, pushed on the Haines' Bluff, which the enemy had commenced evacuating the day before...

The works at Haines' Bluff are very formidable. There are fourteen of the heaviest kind, mounting eight and ten and seven-and-a-half inch rifled guns, with ammunition enough to last a long time.

On the 12th of May, at the Battle of Raymond, the Rebels were defeated, with a loss of 800 men. On the 14th of May, we defeated Gen. Joseph E. Johnston, and captured Jackson, with a loss to the enemy of 400 men.

On the 17th of May we defeated the same force at the Big Black River bridge, with the loss of 2,000 men, and 17 pieces of artillery.

On the 18th of May we invested Vicksburg, and on the 19th of May we carried the rifle-pits on the north of the city. The right of the army rests on the Mississippi, above Vicksburg.

On the 20th of May, at the Battle of Jackson, the Rebels were defeated, with a loss of 2,000 men, and 17 pieces of artillery.
