DEATH OF GEN. ROUSSEAU.

Gen. Rouseau, of the U. S. Army, died at New Orleans at 11 o'clock on Thursday evening, of inflammation of the bowels. He died calmly and peacefully. Gen. Rouseau was one of the best and bravest soldiers of the late war, and a sterling Democrat. He was very popular with his soldiers, who always respected him with thundering cheers, and his troops were always ably and brilliantly handled.

Gen. Rouseau was born in Lincoln county, Ky., in 1820, his father having been a cousin of President Harrison. He was almost wholly self-educated, but he labored so that he was enabled to study law, and was admitted to the bar at Ellettsville, Indiana, in 1841. He was a captain of Indiana volunteers in the Mexican war. Afterwards he was elected to the State Senate. Moving to Louisville in 1849, he was soon after to the Senate of Kentucky. When the rebellion broke out he raised two regiments of Kentuckians for the Federal army. He was a Brigadier General under Buell at Shiloh.

He also commanded a division in McCook's corps in 1862, distinguishing himself in the battle of Perryville, after which he was made a Major General of Volunteers. His career throughout the war was quite a brilliant one. He was commissioned a Brigadier General in the regular army in 1867. On the purchase of Alaska from Russia he was sent thither by the United States to receive possession of it. He was afterwards placed in command of the Fifth Military District, with headquarters at New Orleans. By his just and firm, but mild and patriotic course, he prevented a terrible riot between the whites and the blacks, and won the hatred of Northern Radicals and the respect and esteem of good citizens and patriotic men throughout the Union, who will regret his death and proudly cherish his memory.

RECONSTRUCTION A FAILURE.

That the Reconstruction of the Southern States is a dead failure is proved by the New York Tribune, whose editor sees deeper into a million than any of his Radical contemporaries. At New Orleans, Mr. Greeley reports the following order of events, which is only a sample of what is occurring all over the Southern country under the sealawag regime. He says:

"Appalling corruptions in all branches of the service." "Thieves and plunderers from the first have been in office in Louisiana." "Subordinates in collusion with them carry off their schemes and robbery." "Officers of different districts leagued together in perpetrating and covering up immense cotton frauds amounting to millions." "Over forty licensed distillers running in New Orleans during the last fiscal year, and the Government not collecting tax enough to pay the salaries of the store keepers." "No distiller ever prosecuted in Louisiana to a final conviction." "Bonded warehouses for liquors robbed of thousands of dollars." "Warehouses burned down where the liquors had been previously stored." "Bonds of Collectors wholly worthless and securities nominally invalid." "Warehouses suddenly and secretly converted into stores." "The Judge of an important court openly denounced as unfaithful to his trust." "The U. S. District Attorney charged with being in the 'ring.'" "The defendants in certain wine lawsuits soon to be tried, openly boasting that they have so fixed things that the Government can never obtain a verdict in the U. S. Court." "Gross frauds committed last Winter and Spring in the Custom House."

Custom House officers and Internal Revenue officers colluding together in fraudulent shipment of whiskey. "Men holding small parcels of offices suddenly become rich, covering plantations and valuable stock, others the city property, some spending tens of thousands upon fast women, and others losing still larger sums at the gaming-table and horse-races, and \$40,000 to get elected to a high Congressional post, filling certain New Orleans offices from top to bottom with the negro legislators, and paying them \$3 a day for doing nothing."

Such are the beautiful records connected with Radical reconstruction! How do the taxpayers and laboring masses of the North like it?

THE COLORED TROOPS FOUGHT NOBLY.

A Santa Fe dispatch gives the following particulars of the receipt riot between the white and black troops at Central City, near "Pinos Altos," in New Mexico, in which two white and three colored soldiers were killed, and a large number wounded.

"The difficulty originated at a ball given by the white troops. The negroes claimed a right to dance and participate in the festivities, which was refused them by the whites. A fight ensued, and afterwards the colored troops obtained reinforcements from the fort and returned to the ball-room and killed the white soldiers as they left the house. It is reported that they burned the building and ravished the wife and daughter of the owner."

Those white radicals in the North who advocate and vote for the equality of races, are directly responsible for the bloodshed at Central City. If they continue their amalgamation crusade they will have many more violent deaths to answer for; for unless we are greatly mistaken in the character of the Northern people, they will never permit negro equality to be forced upon them, even by Congressional enactment, without open and armed resistance, if necessary.

Hon. J. LAWRENCE GERTZ, M. C., has our thanks for a copy of the Report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office. It is a valuable and useful work, containing important information, illustrated with an excellent map of the United States.

The United States Senate.

Twenty-two United States Senators, one-third of the entire Senate as now constituted, will go out of office on the 4th of March next. They are: Bayard of Delaware, Buckalew of Pennsylvania, Chandler of Michigan, Conness of California, Dixon of Connecticut, Doolittle of Wisconsin, Edmunds of Vermont, Frelinghuysen of New Jersey, Henderson of Missouri, Hendricks of Indiana, Morgan of New York, Morrill of Maine, Patterson of Tennessee, Ramsey of Minnesota, Sprague of Rhode Island, Stewart of Nevada, Sumner of Massachusetts, Tipton of Nebraska, Van Winkle of West Virginia, Wade of Ohio, Welch of Florida and Whyte of Maryland.

Of this number, six are Democrats and sixteen Republicans. Eight of the prospective vacancies have already been filled, and fourteen remain to be provided for.

Of the eight now Senators already elected, two are now members of the Senate and are chosen for new terms. These are, Edmunds of Vermont, and Sprague of Rhode Island, both Republicans. Abijah Gilbert, of Florida, Republican, has been chosen to succeed A. S. Welch, also a Republican. Gov. Buckingham, of Connecticut, Republican, has been elected in place of Dixon, Democrat; and Brownlow, Republican, of Tennessee, in place of Patterson, also a Democrat.

On the other hand, the Hon. Allen G. Thurman, Democrat, has been chosen by the Legislature of Ohio to succeed Wade, Republican; and Eugene Cassery, also a Democrat, to take the seat of John Conness, of California, a Republican. Maryland has also chosen William T. Hamilton in place of William Pinckney Whyte, both Democrats. So far the new elections leave the political character of the Senate the same as before.

Of the fourteen retiring Senators for whom successors have yet to be provided, four are Democrats—namely, Bayard, of Delaware; Buckalew, of Pennsylvania; Doolittle, of Wisconsin, and Hendricks, of Indiana. Bayard will very likely be re-elected, but each of the others is sure to be succeeded by a Republican. We are not aware, however, who the new Senators from Pennsylvania, Wisconsin and Indiana, are likely to be. Of the remaining ten whose terms expire with the present Congress, all of whom are Republicans, the place of one only—Frelinghuysen, of New Jersey—will be filled by a Democrat. The rest will all be succeeded by Republicans.

The net political result of all these changes will be to take two votes from the Democratic minority of the Senate and add them to the Republican majority.—Phila. Post.

From Mexico.—The steamer Imperatrice, from Vera Cruz, brings still later dates from Mexico. There were many rumors, some of them claiming to come from reliable sources, that Mexico is on the eve of a revolution. It is asserted that the people are disgusted with the administration of Juarez; that the President is controlled by Kerdo di Tejada; that the government officials are in his power, and there is no protection for American residents. An American was murdered outside the walls of Vera Cruz shortly before the sailing of the French steamer. The assassin, although known to the authorities, was suffered to escape, and arrived at Havana yesterday. The United States Consul at Vera Cruz is powerless to protect against the United States, and some of them clamor for another war. It was reported that General Alatorre would head a revolution against Juarez, for the purpose of placing Porfirio Diaz at the head of the Republic.

From Cuba.—General Dulce has issued his proclamation to the Cubans. The news from the interior is to the effect that Count Valmaceda is marching towards Bayamo. The revolutionary forces, strong in numbers, are besieging Gibaro and other towns, and 7000 of them are holding Colonel Tona in check at Tunas. The Marquis Santa Lucia and General Castillo, at the head of the rebel bands, remain in the neighborhood of Puerto Principe. Provisions are arriving at Santiago for the troops, and furnishing the people of the interior.

Death of General Rousseau.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 8.—Gen. Rousseau died very calmly last night 11 o'clock, having taken leave of his friends and staff shortly before. Manifestations of regret are universal. To-day being a holiday—the anniversary of the battle of New Orleans—all the flags, both of the foreign consulates and American, are at half-mast and draped in mourning.

The news from St. Domingo is unfavorable to the government party. General Adon had crossed the frontier from Hayti, and joined the rebel General Organdos' forces.
