

NEWS ITEMS.

A light took place at Chester last week between two boys, named James Weil, aged 13 years, and John Thomas, aged 16 years, during which Thomas was stabbed in the left breast with an ordinary pocket knife, causing almost instant death. The witness of the affair testified before the Mayor that Thomas was lying in wait for Weil, and that Weil was struck twice before Thomas was stabbed. Weil was sent to jail at Medina.

Mr. John Kuns, of Cass county, Michigan, is seventy-two years old, and yet is a capital marksman with the rifle. Recently he shot thirty-four hogs, at from forty to seventy yards, in front of the ear, killing each at the first shot so dead that not one of them squealed. He also shot the heads off two chickens at two or three rods. Mr. Kuns shot without glasses.

A white man, named Hays, was murdered, recently, by three negro soldiers, at Hays City, Kansas. The murderers were lodged in jail, but during the night a vigilance committee took them out and hanged them. Conflicts between the white and colored soldiers at that post have been so frequent that the latter have been removed to a distance.

It is stated that some of the dealers in flour in New York are in the habit of swindling their customers by opening the bottom of barrels of fine flour, at the bottom, and substituting an inferior quality. As the top only of the barrel is opened by the buyer, he never discovers the cheat till he uses a greater part of it.

"Champagne Fritz," the son of a Lutheran clergyman in Germany, died in a hospital, in Milwaukee, a few days ago. He was sent to this country in the hope of improvement, but, after spending \$16,000 in gold, mostly on champagne, he died, before \$50,000 left him, by his deceased father reached him.

A schooner drifted ashore at Quantic beach, New Jersey, a few nights ago. She was fifty-one days from Jamaica, loaded with logwood. The captain, his wife, and mate, were on board—the crew had died on the passage. The vessel was in a very bad condition.

The obolisk in the Place de la Concorde, in Paris, is said to be decaying. It withstood the climate during thirty centuries in Egypt, whence it was transported, but under the action of the weather in Paris it is beginning to crumble and pulverize.

A respectable old green grocer died last month, and left \$15,000 to Charles Dickens, on condition that he will read his "Trial from Pickwick" in the presence of the G. G.'s family once a year till he dies.

The grave of John Harris, the founder of Harrisburg, is at the foot of the tree to which he was once tied by Indians, and a fine kindled altar stands to his grave. A simple iron fence surrounds the grave.

A Fortress Monroe despatch reports three barks ashore near Cape Henry, and a storm prevailing. A number of vessels have put into Hampton Roads for refuge.
