From Schuylkill County—The Missouri State Court. On the 11th inst., Charles A. Ryan, late Clerk of Court at Quarter Sessions, was tried yesterday.

The much discussed Rosanna Faust case, which has been pending for some time, was called for trial, but the array being challenged by John W. Ryan, Esq., for counsel, upon argument the challenge was sustained.

There is a singular fatality about this Court. Judge Green was commissioned nearly two years ago, and yet not a case has been tried therein, although every term the county has large amounts of fees and expenses to pay, in addition to the salary of the Judge.

Various other bills were introduced. The House resolution giving the rotunda of the Capitol for the inauguration ball was rejected by 7 votes.

A resolution was adopted for the appointment of a Teller to count the Electoral votes. In the House, J. E. Elliot, elected to succeed Mr. Hinds of Arkansas, was qualified and took his seat.

Mr. Butler offered a substitute, extending the protectorate over the Islands of the Antilles; and Mr. Spalding of Ohio, moved an amendment expending it over all islands in the Atlantic and Pacific, adjacent to the United States.
