At first sight this bill may not appear objectionable, but closer investigation shows that it is "a snake in the grass" that it sometimes takes them a good while that should be scotched and killed at to kill a person with small arms. In

In the first place, it authorizes the consolidation of corporations to an unlimited extent. The injurious effect of such measures has been already too severely felt by the people at large, and any furth er attempts at centralization should be guarded against.

In the second place, the bill is indistinct as to the limit of the powers and the time for which they are conferred, and hence is highly dangerous to the business interests of all our people excepting those large corporations in whose interest this bill was created.

. Such a contingenty renders it necessary that the public press should at once denounce any such at tempt to throw the control of the prin cipal industrial interests of this State into the hands of one or more powerful and greedy corporations, which only care to enrich themselves, regardless of the rights and prosperity of the people generally.

We call upon our Senators and Representatives at Harrisburg to watch this bill closely, and expose its designs, so that it may be so effectually defeated that mammoth corporations will see the inutility of further attempts to enslave the people of this Commonwealth for their own selfish purposes.

THE PROPOSED PARTEENTH ARTICLE OF the Constitution of the United States, which is causing so much excitement at present, is as follows:

Be it resolved, &c., two thirds of both Houses concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of the United States be submitted to the Legislatures of the several States, and when ratified by three-fourths thereof it shall

be a part of said Constitution.

Article XV. The right of the citizens of the United States to vote stall not be denied or abridged by the United States. or by any State, on account of race, color. or previous condition of servitude.

Ser. 2. The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate
