





"Whenever in any school, district the parents of twenty five or more pupils of any public school shall certify to the board of school directors of such district, that they desire the German language, it shall be the duty of such directors, without unnecessary delay, to adopt measures for instituting German classes in said school, or for establishing separate schools for that purpose."
