GENERAL NEWS OF INDUSTRIES

Interesting Statistics Touching the Volume of Freight Business Last Year.

THE RAILROADS IN THIS STATE

Synopsis of Their Reports to the Department of Internal Affairs at Harrisburg-Movement of Goods Not Yet Up to Former Standards-Increasing Brightness in the Iron and Steel Outlook-Salient Points in Dan's Weekly Trade Review and Minor Notes.

From reports received at the state department of internal affairs it is ascertained that there has been an increase in all kinds of freight carried by railroads during the year 1893, except agricultural products.

Last year the tonnage from our great mining interests amounted to 171,913,484 tons. This year the amount was 180,354,176, an increase of 8,620,692, or 5 per cent.

The Pennsylvania, Philadelphia and Reading, New York, Lake Erie and Western, Delaware and Chesapeake, and Western, and Northern Central practically carried all of the coal.

In the report for last year, the products of forests were given at 15,833,793 tons; the amount this year, 16,992,476, an increase of 1,158,683 tons.

Under the head of miscellaneous merchandise the number of tons reported last year was 20,882,933; this year, 23,911,499, an increase of 3,028,566 tons.

Referring to the compensation of railroad employes it is said that to the 200,158 employes there was paid during the year \$11,123,788.75 an average compensation of \$55.07.

The five companies employing the largest number of persons were the Pennsylvania, Philadelphia and Reading, the New York, Lake Erie and Western, the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati and Chicago and St. Louis, the Erie and Western, and the Erie and Western.

During the year these companies had in their service 138,106 employes, or 68 per cent of the total number reported to the department.

The compensation paid by these companies was \$79,738,931.24, or 67 per cent of the entire amount paid by all the roads.

The Pennsylvania road had 54,611 employes to whom it paid \$3,690,420.48; the Philadelphia and Reading, 31,759 employes, paying \$1,750,301.75.

Says Dan: A large demand gives encouragement in the iron and steel manufacture and increases the output of mills, though it is yet only 50 to 60 per cent of their capacity.

Hence competition continues to depress prices, and while the recent slight advance in steel billets and pig iron has been lost, some other products are selling lower than ever.

The failures during the past week numbered in the United States 288, against 193 last year, and in Canada 51, against 37 last year.

Both in number and in magnitude commercial disasters have diminished, according to Dan, and in the first half of February the liabilities thus far reported of all firms failing amounted to only \$3,319,659.

The aggregate of liabilities was \$9,619,322 in two weeks in January.

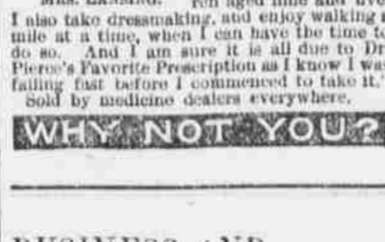
