Trolley Electric Transit System to Extend From Gotham to Washington.

LATEST BIG ELECTRICAL SCHEME.

Also Another Direct Line Contemplated from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh, That is if the Elkins-Widener Trolley Syndicate is not indulging in a Little Springtime Talking Contest—Better Look Out for Flying Machines—Activities in the Anthracite Field and Other Pertinent News and Gossip of Industries.

The trolley goes marching on. Its latest phase is comprised in a gigantic scheme to run a continuous trolley system from New York to Washington, and from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh.

The Engineering and Mining Journal says the total coal production of the United States in 1893 was 183,423,710 tons, and adds: These figures are surprising, for notwithstanding the severe business depression which existed throughout the country during the last year of 1893, there has been an increase of 3,028,093 tons, or 1.67 per cent over that produced in 1892, making 1893 the banner year of coal production in the United States.

A dispatch from Hazleton says: Despite the dull times and depressed condition of the coal trade, operators in this section are preparing to begin work on the new railroad in the anthracite region. The coal trade is depressed, but this is almost balanced by the increase from the anthracite mines of 2.5 per cent.

Work on constructing the new line which is to connect the Cumberland Valley railroad and the Western Virginia & Pennsylvania railroad will be in progress. The new road is to be built between Cumberland and Hagerstown.
