END OF LICENSE COURT

Court Has Listened to All the Argument for and Against Granting.

THE THIRTEENTH WARD CASES

They Were Before the Court Yesterday—Remonstrances in Every Case. Mr. Okell Denies Statements Made by Mr. Woodruff—Jones an Exceptional Colored Man—Large Number of New Applicants at Winton.

After listening to the arguments why licenses should be granted this year to about 150 new houses in this county, which have been advanced since Monday, court at 5 o'clock last evening adjourned until Monday morning.

When court opened yesterday morning, Colonel F. J. Fitzsimons urged the claims of Thomas Harrington, of the First ward of this city, for a hotel license, and Attorney T. P. Hoban did the same for John K. Jones, of 189 West Market street, but the request was opposed by Attorney A. A. Voburg on the ground that the proposed hotel is close to No. 26 school building.
